School Report

We ended last term fantastically with a wonderful Christmas production, which all of the children took part in; we received several positive comments about the new arrangements using the Village Hall as a venue.

We were very proud of two of our pupils who performed in professional shows at Christmas – one in the Nutcracker at the Birmingham Hippodrome and another in Sleeping Beauty at the Everyman Cheltenham.

We have been really busy since our return though with our children enjoying educational, cultural, musical and sporting opportunities!

Able Writers

Some of our children went on an ‘Able Writers’ workshop where they met fiction author David Gatward. Our Eagles pupils took part in the Primary Maths Challenge where they sat a test of 25 questions. A score of over 21 would put them into the national finals and whilst none of our children achieved this we did have some very close results! All children received a certificate and additional awards were presented. Some of our Y4/5 pupils will be taking part in another Maths challenge at Cheltenham College this week.

Music workshop

Music has been high profile with our children being treated to a music workshop demonstration involving the double bass and ‘cello – some were even chosen to play a duet with the teacher. Encouragingly, it inspired one of our Y6 pupils to join a Gloucester music group where she is now learning to play the double bass! Also in a new venture, Owls and Eagles have been learning to play the Ukulele in whole class lessons.

Sessions are going very well, with lots of enthusiasm from the children. We now have a Gretton Choir which has grown to 27 strong! We are planning to put on a Music Gala just before the Easter break to showcase to parents the children’s achievements in music including individual instrument lessons, choir club, ukulele and percussion club.

Nepal connection

We have made a special link to a school (Shree Jandeep School) in Nepal through our new teacher Mr Bridges who worked there in the summer. We plan to exchange letters, photos and other information, to help raise awareness of other cultures. We also hope to arrange some fundraising opportunities in order to support the school’s development.

After school clubs

Our children have been enjoying lots of after school clubs such as Library, Cross Country, Dance, Percussion, Pet & Football Clubs this term.

Members of Dance Club are busy preparing for the Feet First festival in Cheltenham. They have chosen to perform in the style of a national dance from Nepal to link with our new partnership.

We have also been doing some fundraising – we collected 26 Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes. Some of our pupils took part in bag packing at the Winchcombe Co-Op raising £267.64 and the Children’s Society received £207.19 from the Christingle collection.
