Dear Friends,

I have it on very good authority that I have been given a nickname by some good villagers of Dumbleton! Apparently I am known by many as 'Waldorf' one of the curmudgeonly old characters in the 'Muppets'! He always has something to moan or complain about. What Me? Never!

One of my complaints is that people mumble, especially those on television. You turn on the tele and watch your programme, adjusting the sound to your hearing and then turn to another Channel where either the volume is so high it blasts you out of your chair, or it is so quiet you think you have gone completely mutt and Jeff! Or the characters mumble...and I find this worse amongst pop singers. For years I thought one of the lines to Creedence Clearwater Revival's song Bad Moon Rising was 'there's a bathroom on the right', Paul Young appeared to tell his girlfriend 'Every time you go away, you take a piece of meat with you' and my late mother was convinced that Crystal Gail was advocating a new eye and beauty treatment when she sang 'Doughnuts make my brown eyes blue'. After thinking about things you suddenly realise that what you think you saw, what you think you heard, was in fact something totally different. Thus: 'She's got a chicken to ride' when you listen to the lyrics carefully is actually 'She's got a ticket to ride'.

I often think the events of Holy Week and Easter are a bit like that. We see and we don't understand, we listen and the words don't make sense. Who in their right mind would want to kill a good man who never did anyone any harm; who healed the sick, cured the lame, and was available for any who wanted to talk to him? Did we really hear correctly the crowds shouting for a bloody murderer to be released rather than Jesus? What was Pilate mumbling about when he declared Christ innocent and then the next minute washed his hands of the whole ghastly affair? The Disciples also fell prey to misunderstandings...first Jesus alive, then they witnessed the Crucifixion, then they laid Him in the grave....and then they are expected to believe He was alive! Had they heard correctly? Did they mishear? Some said they had seen him, others that they hadn't and wouldn't believe any of it. It was only when they fitted all the pieces together and calmed down and LISTENED to each other carefully that everything fell into place. One Disciple would say 'Don't you remember Jesus saying...?' and another would say 'Yes and he also said ...' and before you know it the whole jigsaw puzzle was completed and almost sprung to life. As you read the narrative there appears to be a group who had listened carefully ... the women in the band of followers. They had listened, they had worked it out and it was (in my opinion) the women who steadied the nerves of their male counterparts (who couldn't believe their own eyes) by recounting what they had seen on that early Easter Sunday morning. They blurted out 'Christ has Risen' and down the centuries, if we have
